



# Prescott Weekend Update



February 11<sup>th</sup>, 2024

Good Afternoon PLC Families:

When I finally move on from my career in education there are a lot of things I am going to miss, especially the people. However, one thing I will definitely not miss are all of the surveys: both sending them out to people and having to do them myself. That said, with so many people needing to be involved in making important decisions about children and their education, surveys are a fact of life. And in terms of surveys, from a school perspective, few are more important than Alberta Education's Assurance Measure Results Survey. The annual survey is administered throughout the province to grade four, seven, and ten students as well as their families. For Prescott, this means that we will be providing time at school for our grade four and seven students to complete the survey. Their parents and guardians will receive a single-use random access code through the mail in order to complete the survey online.

Why is the survey so important? In many ways, the Assurance Survey is a report card for the school. Part of the survey results comes from quantitative data including Provincial Achievement Test (PATs) results (or Diploma Exams and graduation rates for high school). Now, I am happy to tell you that our PAT results from last spring were some of the best in the school's history. And while there are always areas for improvement, coming out COVID the fact that many of the test results exceeded the province reflects the hard work the students and staff are doing here at the school. Match this up with our pronounced improvement on numeracy and literacy benchmarking results and it is abundantly clear that the school is trending in the right direction. (I will have more on these results in a future memo).

The survey also asks questions related to student engagement, citizenship, education quality, access to supports and services, parental involvement, and even how welcoming, safe, and caring the school is. And this is an area of concern. For starters, while the survey was opened to nearly 200 families last year, only 23 individuals (thank you BTW) completed the survey. Further, despite the incredible improvement in the hard numbers, the PATs and literacy/numeracy benchmarks, the school fared poorly on the questions I just mentioned at the top of this paragraph. Interestingly, decline in our school results were nearly identical to declines witnessed across the school division and across the province. In fact, the graphs nearly overlapped each other. What was also noteworthy about these results was that for the most part, the students rated PLC better in these categories than the adults. I'm left to wonder if our families were making a statement about education in the province in general rather than the school specifically: or maybe not. What I do know is that as much as I'd like to sit down over a coffee and ask each of you for your thoughts and ideas on how to make our school better for your children, that's just not feasible (and Mrs. Shaw may have something to say about how much time this would take).

Instead I need to ask more of you with children in grade four and seven to take a few minutes of your valuable time to complete the survey. The survey is completely anonymous for students and families, and I also need to ask that you be open and honest not only about what you feel we are doing well, but also on what you think we need to work on for improvement. If you have

any questions about the survey or about the school in general, you can always reach out to me at the school. Until then, here's what is happening at the school this week.
