

# **Prescott Weekend Update**



May 12th, 2024

#### Good Afternoon PLC Families:

(Please Note: This week's memo was written before we all woke up to the smoke yesterday morning. If the Air Quality Health Index Remains above an acceptable level, we will need to postpone the Track Meet this Wednesday. I hope to have an update for your Tuesday Evening and/or Wednesday Morning. I ask that you check your email)

It's track and field season here at the school and that means that there will be parking disruptions over the next few weeks. This Wednesday is the Grade Four through Nine Track Meet. (The Grade One through Three Field Day will take place on Tuesday June 11th, please mark your calendars if you are able to volunteer for this event).

Why will a track meet cause traffic disruption? As I mentioned last year (and will likely mention next year) while we have a beautiful school with many amenities, if there is one aspect of our building that is left wanting it is our gym space and the field. As a result, we require our front parking lot as a venue to host running events. Because of this, please be aware **the parking lot will be closed this Wednesday, both before and after school**. It is safe to assume that traffic will be a challenge on this day. Please give yourself plenty of extra time for drop off and pick up or please consider a different pick up or drop off location. Better yet, it's track and field day! If possible, consider walking to school. Most importantly, please slow down. It is going to be busy, and no doubt, some people will be frustrated with the slow traffic flow; I ask for extra patience on Wednesday. Please keep in mind that there is nothing more important than keeping everyone safe. I will send you an email reminder Tuesday evening. Thanks for your patience and cooperation.

While the weather is (currently) looking like it will be overcast and 19 degrees, it is still a good idea to consider sending along a hat, water bottle, and high SPF sunblock in your child(ren)'s knapsack. Between recess, field trips, and of course upcoming track meets, if won't take much for too much sun. Please send along sunblock for your kids. While blankets for sitting are encouraged at the track meet, please note that tents are not permitted, so please keep these at home. 


