Safety Reminders - For safety reasons please we are asking for your cooperation in reinforcing the message that kids walk their bikes, scooters, and skateboards (or anything else with a wheel for that matter) throughout the entire campus, not just in front of the buses. We are starting to notice that once kids get to the last 1/3 of the bus lane they hop on a wheel away. Because we are using the entire bus lane for drop off and pick up we are worried that our
