Not sure if you caught the news earlier this fall, but the Australian Government is considering a full social media ban for any children under 16 years old. This would mean that kids 15 and under would lose access to platforms such as TikTok, Instagram, even FaceBook (no word on YouTube). Currently the government is experimenting with 'age verification software', though there are concerns whether or not the technology exists to enforce such a ban, let alone whether a ban will prevent any of the harms often associated with social media.

Now the merits or detriments to such a ban are for another weekend memo. However, the article did give me pause to reflect on how our own provincial government's ban on personal mobile devices is (or isn't) working at our school. Currently at PLC, students in Kindergarten through Grade Six are not permitted to use personal mobile devices (cell phones, tablets, smart watches, earbuds) at any time during the school day. Grade Seven through Nine students, many who often leave for lunch hour, have different privileges. To be consistent with the other Spruce Grove Kindergarten to Grade Nine Schools, PLC Jr. High students are permitted a three-minute check for messages at the beginning of first recess and for five minutes just before classes at the end of lunch hour. When students are given their technology break at recess or at the end of lunch, we typically play a three- or five-minute song over the PA system to let students know that their tech window is open. They are not permitted to check their social media feeds or visit websites. gaming websites in particular.

For the most part, students have been cooperative: remarkably cooperative in fact. While there is the odd incident (usually earbuds), and certainly kids are sneaking a peek here and there, in comparison to last school year when we sought your input in implementing our own cell phone ban during class time, this year has been more than quiet. However, this past Thursday at the end of lunch while the music played, I did a quick survey and noticed that very few kids had their phones out. I had to have a hard look to find any students engaged with their phones at all. What were they doing? They were talking and joking with friends, and it was kind of cool to see kids socializing again. My point? No prohibition is 100% effective. But it is good to see that, at least on the surface, it appears that the ban on personal mobile devices is having its intended effect; kids get to be kids again. And now, here's what's going on at PLC this week.

#### **New and Updated Information**

**Grade Three Candy Grams -** For the 9th year in a row the Prescott Grade 3 classes will be offering the candy gram program to our students and families. Students and families can purchase a \$1 candy gram for a student in our school. A candy gram is a small card filled out with the name and grade of the recipient. A small message can also be added to the card. An actual candy cane is attached to the card before being delivered to the recipient. There will be 2 times in which candy grams can be purchased. Firstly, families may buy candy grams before and after all four of our Christmas concerts on December 4th and 5th. There will be a table set up in the main area outside the gym.

Candy grams will also be available during lunch hours, so all students have the opportunity to participate. Lunch time sales will occur on the following days: Tuesday, December 10 - Friday, December 13. The grade 3 classes will organize and deliver the candy grams during the last week of school, before Christmas Break.

Last year over \$2400.00 dollars was raised. Grade 3 students worked together to decide where proceeds would be donated. It was decided that the proceeds would be split evenly between the Parkland Food Bank, the Stollery Children's Hospital and the Against Malaria International Foundation. 
