This week I need to ask our Junior High families to take a knee while I talk about the upcoming Christmas/Winter Concerts happening at the school this week. For starters the concerts involve students in Kindergarten through Grade Six. Because of the fire code and the expected number of guests, we are required to break these concerts into two parts; families with the student's last name beginning from A-K on Wednesday; and families with the student's last name beginning from L-Z on Thursday.

December School Council Meeting Date Change - As a result of the Christmas Concert on Wednesday, Dec. 4th, the date for the December School Council meeting has been changed to this Tuesday. Dec. 3rd at 6:30. Invitations will be in your inbox tomorrow morning. A reminder, our School Council is the school's community's voice. You will not be asked to volunteer or attend future meetings. What you will be asked is for your input on how to make our school better meet the needs of your child(ren) and for any questions you may have about school operations. I hope to see you this Tuesday.

Grade Three Candy Grams - For the 9th year in a row the Prescott Grade 3 classes will be offering the candy gram program to our students and families. Students and families can purchase a \$1 candy gram for a student in our school. A candy gram is a small card filled out with the name and grade of the recipient. A small message can also be added to the card. An actual candy cane is attached to the card before being delivered to the recipient. There will be 2 times in which candy grams can be purchased. Firstly, families may buy candy grams before and after all four of our Christmas concerts on December 4th and 5th. There will be a table set up in the main area outside the gym.

Candy grams will also be available during lunch hours, so all students have the opportunity to participate. Lunch time sales will occur on the following days: Tuesday, December 10 - Friday, December 13. The grade 3 classes will organize and deliver the candy grams during the last week of school, before Christmas Break.

Last year over \$2400.00 dollars was raised. Grade 3 students worked together to decide where proceeds would be donated. It was decided that the proceeds would be split evenly between the Parkland Food Bank, the Stollery Children's Hospital and the Against Malaria International Foundation. Thank you for supporting this fun and worthwhile cause. Each year our grade 3 students are so proud to make a difference in the lives of others.

Cst. Gord Grade Nine Visit - This Tuesday RCMP School Resource Officer Gord Marshall will be at the school discussing Social Justice and the Criminal Youth code as part of the Grade Nine Social Studies Curriculum. He will be speaking to all Grade Nine classes at the same time


December Stronger Together
