Board Chair Report:

PSD hosted two MLA's at the Alberta School Board's breakfast meeting at the Fall General Meeting (Boitichenko and Turton)

The government has indicated that there will be a new funding model in the 2025 budget to replace the current Weighted Moving Average which greatly affects growing school boards such as ours.
